


# 'Wired for Good'

AWI celebrates 75 years in business with £1m investment

2021 marks a milestone moment in our history, with Alloy Wire **International celebrating 75 years** of manufacturing 'High Performance' nickel alloys.

After discussions with staff at our West Midlands and Yorkshire sites, we have launched 'Wired for Good', a campaign that will see us boost our work supporting local charities and, importantly, committing to becoming carbon neutral.



This means all manufacturing, deliveries and even employee commuting emissions will need to be offset and we have partnered with a number of specialist organisations to achieve this, with the focus on woodland creation, solar/wind and sustainability projects.

Mark Venables, Managing Director of AWI, commented: "75 years in business is a major achievement and the last 12 months have certainly been some of the most challenging yet, with our staff going above and beyond to support the global fightback against the pandemic.

"Despite the challenges, sales have held up well and demand across 15 key market sectors has surged since January 2021 and this bodes well for our big anniversary year."

He continued: "We've got some really big plans for our birthday celebrations, including a £1million investment in new wet drawing machines and increasing our stockholding to 240 tonnes, the latter meaning we are able to offer our unrivalled two-week industry lead times.

"We also wanted to do something different that makes a positive social difference. With sustainability on many people's agenda, we felt the time was right to become 'carbon neutral', a significant commitment when you consider we produce wire and export to over 65 countries.

"'Wired for Good' will govern all of our 75th activities and we're looking forward to announcing more positive projects in the coming weeks."

Alloy Wire International was founded in 1946 by John Stockdale in an old ambulance station in Old Hill in the Black Country.

The company's founding principles of 'manufacturing quality, delivering reliability' has stood the test of time and still remains a crucial part of how we deal with a global client base, spanning automotive, aerospace, medical, nuclear and oil and gas.

Today, the firm is employee-owned with most of the staff owning shares in the business, a decision made by existing Chairman Bill Graham and the current Senior Management Team.




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## **AWI's new website is coming soon!**

### Introducing our new testing capability

Work has now been completed on our new testing room in the West Midlands, which will help shorten lead times on orders and reduce dependence on external test houses.

AWI's Technical Director Andrew Du Plessis and his four-strong team have designed and equipped the facility to include two tensile testers, a Micro-Vickers Hardness tester, Metallographic Preparation, Macro and Micro imaging and four lab furnaces to support heat treatment.

More than £500,000 has been invested in the project and it took over six months to complete the build and fit-out.

"We were increasingly asked for more testing as our customers strive for more exacting performance from the materials they purchase," explained Andrew.

"The decision was taken as part of an overall commitment to improve our service and the range of testing we can deliver in-house, and this is reflected in the level of investment and extent of capability we can now offer."

He concluded: "What this means to our clients is that we will have far greater control over testing and, I have no doubt, this will reduce lead times for them.

"Better imaging facilities will also significantly boost our R&D activity, so we can continue to bring new materials and services to market."
